This Website Privacy Policy & Terms of Use governs your use of this website and the materials and information on it. Privacy statement

On our website, we collect personal information about you only when you explicitly provide it. Examples of that collection would be when you submit a story or register for a public consultation event. We protect the personal information given to us when you fill out a form. We have implemented security measures to ensure that your personal information is not lost, misused, altered, or unintentionally destroyed.

What do we mean by personal information?

By "personal information" we mean any information about you as an identifiable individual including:

- Basic identifying information: such as your name, address, or email address;
- Demographic information: such as your age, sex, and profession;
- User-generated information: such as your comments or responses to surveys; and
- User-behaviour information: such as the web pages you viewed.

Why do we collect this information?

To inform better policy. The principal reason for collecting this information is to help the Commission make policy recommendations on how to transform inclusive education in Nova Scotia. This information is therefore provided for analysis and interpretation.

To send you periodic emails. The email address you provide when you submit information to the Commission or register for an event may be used by the Commission to send you information and updates pertaining to the issues on this site. If at any time you would like to unsubscribe from receiving future emails, we include a contact email at the bottom of each email for this purpose.

To improve the website and software. We may also use this information to help us improve the website and the experience of participants based on your feedback.

Further information. We may release or use your personal information provided on the websites for the purpose for which it was provided or for a compatible purpose, as described in the [Commission's Consultation and Engagement Privacy Notice](#).

What we don't do
